We are blessed to have the staff, alumnae, and volunteers who make this program so successful. We are expanding our outreach in the community. The Food Pantry committee has created a pilot program to work with kids in need through a partnership with Communities in Schools of Clark County, in an attempt to supply them with food during their school breaks.

Though we celebrate the work being done through the Center's current programs at Bliss House and the Food Pantry, the Board of CLM continues to brainstorm and search for new ways to provide services to vulnerable populations in our local community with compassion, dignity, and respect. A Year of Change

I think the 2018-19 fiscal year was a year of change for the Center for Lay Ministries. Perhaps the biggest change was that Greg Henderzahs retired after serving more than five years as the Executive Director. I was lucky enough to be chosen as his

replacement and started working at CLM last November. I love my work at CLM and feel very fortunate to be in this position.

But, I wasn't the only staff addition at CLM in the last year. In July 2018, we hired our first paid Volunteer Coordinator Jane Hubbard. And in September Stephanie Satterly joined us as the full-time Bliss House Assistant Director.

Other new additions include the work of the Fund Development Committee who organized our first Hunger to Hope Gala in August of 2018. We also hosted our first Blessings for Breakfast event in April of 2019. These events featured the work and mission of both the Bliss House and Food Pantry while serving as fundraisers for our organization. We have expanded the Food Pantry hours. We are now open six days a week and open late on Tuesdays. We are serving 800 people in Clark County each month through the Food Pantry. We continue to work closely with Dare to Care, Metro United Way, Midwest Food Bank, Meijer, Kroger, Aldi, as well as many local churches, organizations, businesses, and individuals who donate food to us.

The Bliss House celebrated 11 graduations in the last year. This program is providing hope to women in recovery—and their families—every day. Thanks to our generous donors, the Bliss House received a new 15 passenger van in 2018. And, we recognized the women in Bliss House with a Celebration Tea in June.

One thing that never changes is that we know we are blessed to be helping people in our community. We are grateful to everyone who supports and volunteers with CLM. Our volunteers and donors are amazing. We know our work would not be possible without your support.

And since change brings new opportunities, we are looking forward to lots of new opportunities for the Center for Lay Ministries in 2020 and beyond!



# **CLM Food Pantry By the Numbers**

In the CLM Food Pantry, we had 10,220 client visits between July 1, 2018 and June 30, 2019. When you add in the family members of those clients, we helped to feed 21,352 during the year. The previous fiscal year we fed 19,348 people. So we provided food to 2,004 more people in 2018-19. We gave away 456,240 pounds of food in 2018-19, which was 17,229 more pounds of food than we gave away the year before.



## **CLM Bliss House**

CLM Bliss House is a residential program for women in recovery from alcohol and/or substance abuse. We are truly saving lives with this recovery program. Our mission at Bliss House is to improve the quality of life in our community by improving the quality of life for individual

community members as they work through the recovery process.

We have the capacity to house twelve women in the program. In the fiscal year 2018-19 we served a total of 32 residents in Bliss House. We had 11 women graduate from the program. The average length of stay for graduates was 10 months.

During 2018-19, we served women from the following counties:

- Clark 13 women = 41% of residents in Bliss House
- Floyd 7 women = 22% of residents in Bliss House
- Harrison 3 women = 9% of residents in Bliss House
- Other counties include:
   Crawford, Jefferson, Jennings, Ohio,
   Orange, Washington, and Jefferson,
   KY 9 women = 28% of residents in
   Bliss House

All Bliss House residents must find employment, complete chores, and pay rent. While they are in the Bliss House program, residents must complete a 12 Step Recovery Program that is supported by mandatory AA/NA meetings. All residents attend

house meetings and follow house rules.

#### Bliss Too

We also offer Bliss Too transitional housing for those who graduate from the Bliss House program. Bliss Too allows women to live independently while having continued access to programs and a network that helps foster long-term recovery. Bliss Too offers our graduates a chance to build financial security before moving out

into the community.

#### **Bliss House Alumnae**

The Alumnae Association is open to any graduate of the Bliss House. The goal of the Alumnae is to be a long-term recovery network. Members serve as mentors to current Bliss House residents. They also host events for our current residents which demonstrates a key component to maintaining long -term recovery—giving back what has been so freely given.
